LETTER FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND BOARD CHAIR

Saying three simple words, *Home Sweet Home*, can bring so much overwhelming joy, especially to someone who has experienced the trauma of homelessness and then returned to stable permanent housing. At Montgomery County Coalition for the Homeless (MCCH), we believe that every person is entitled to the dignity of a home.

With your help, in the 2014 fiscal year we served nearly 1,600 currently and formerly homeless men, women and children. More than 770 people reside in our permanent housing programs with 95% maintaining their housing throughout the year. With the launching of our Vulnerability Initiative Program and our Veterans Affairs Safe Haven program, 20 additional individuals in our community experienced relief and joy when they opened the door to their new home.

Home Sweet Home for Veterans. We were honored to be awarded funding to provide low-barrier Safe Haven emergency housing for up to 15 chronically homeless veterans with severe and persistent mental illness and/or substance abuse disorder, thanks to our partnership with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs VA Capitol Health Care Network. Between March and June 2014, we opened two VA Safe Haven locations. Of the nine veterans who were served during fiscal year 2014, two moved into permanent housing.

Home Sweet Home for Medically Vulnerable and Chronically Homeless Individuals. In partnership with local government agencies, nonprofits, and other organizations, MCCH co-led the Montgomery County 100,000 Homes Campaign, part of a national campaign to end homelessness for our community's most medically vulnerable and chronically homeless individuals who faced the highest likelihood of death if they remained unsheltered. In December 2013, the Montgomery County Council awarded MCCH a special appropriation to house with medical supports 15 of the most vulnerable individuals. This funding enabled us to launch our Vulnerability Initiative Program in April 2014.

These successes and more are possible because of our compassionate professional staff members who dedicate themselves to helping clients succeed and never experience homelessness again, and our network of generous supporters—community members, government agencies, foundations, congregations, organizations, and corporations—who, through their donations and volunteer efforts, partner with MCCH in our work to end homelessness.

Thank you for supporting our mission to provide solutions to ensure that homelessness in Montgomery County is rare, brief, and nonrecurring. Because of you, men, women, and children in our community are experiencing *Home Sweet Home*.

HOME SWEET HOME: OUR WORK IN FISCAL YEAR 2014

Our Mission and Vision

Working together, Montgomery County Coalition for the Homeless and our affiliate Coalition Homes provide solutions to ensure that homelessness in Montgomery County is rare, brief, and nonrecurring. Our vision is to end homelessness in Montgomery County by building a community where everyone has a safe, stable, and affordable place to call home.

Our Programs

Permanent Supportive Housing

In FY14, 155 families, 308 children in families, and 251 single adults who were once homeless maintained stable and affordable housing throughout the county in our seven permanent supportive housing (PSH) programs. PSH clients have dedicated case managers who help them address the challenges that led to their homelessness and ensure they remain stably housed. Clients receive help with budgeting, securing benefits, completing job and school applications, accessing medical and mental health services, and more. All clients pay 30% of their income to rent and hold a lease for their unit. Clients can remain in our programs permanently, but many move on once they are capable of independent living and no longer need case management support.

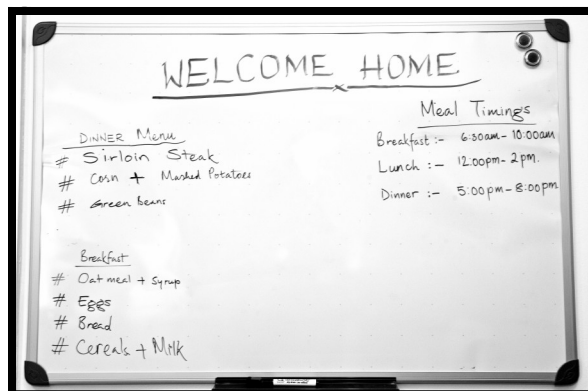

Emergency Shelter and Housing Programs

Since 1990, MCCH has provided shelter to men experiencing homelessness. Our Home Builders Care Assessment Center (HBCAC) men's emergency shelter, is the county's only year-round shelter for men, served 739 men in fiscal year 2014. HBCAC provides clients on-site access to shelter, food, medical and psychiatric care, Back-to-Work mentoring services, and a dedicated case manager who meet their urgent needs and reconnect them to stable housing. We are pleased to report that through a housing locator position and case management services, 156 formerly homeless men moved into permanent housing in fiscal year 2014.

Our Safe Haven and VA Safe Haven emergency housing programs are shared homes that serve severely mentally ill men and women who have experienced chronic homelessness. Our six Safe Haven locations are staffed 24/7, and each client is assigned a case manager whose main goal is to help them develop independent living skills and connect them to stable housing. Clients also have access to an on-site psychiatrist who holds group and one-on-one sessions. Safe Haven clients who receive government assistance pay 30% of their income toward an occupancy fee. In fiscal year 2014, Safe Haven and VA Safe Haven programs served 67 men and women, of whom 13 moved on to permanent supportive housing.



Coalition Homes, Inc.

Our Affiliate Organization

Coalition Homes, a nonprofit housing development organization created in 2005 owns and operates 96 units of affordable permanent supportive housing for formerly homeless individuals and families.

Volunteer Opportunities

We are thankful to be a part of a caring community that volunteers time to support the vulnerable men, women, and children in our programs. In FY14, 3,630 volunteers dedicated over 11,000 hours in community service by preparing meals, completing landscaping projects, serving as Back-to-Work program mentors, holding collection drives, providing office support, and more.

We are especially grateful to our meal donors who provided over 90,000 meals at our HBCAC men's emergency shelter. This represents 64% of our annual meal needs, allowing us to reallocate financial resources to other critical client needs.

Our Community Engagement

Raising Awareness of the Issue of Homelessness

Our new Speakers Bureau helped clients gain valuable public speaking skills and self confidence, empowering them to share their stories with congregations, businesses, schools, county and elected officials, community groups, and local media. Clients are trained by staff on effective communication and are compensated for their work.

Through the Fannie Mae Help the Homeless Walks, community group walks, and our signature Walk 'n Roll event in May 2014, our community friends helped MCCH raise awareness of the issue of homelessness and close to \$80,000 in critical funds to support our programs.

Home Sweet Home: Celebrating Partnerships Gala

At this annual event, 225 guests raised over \$130,000 as we recognized invaluable contributions from our partners.

Distinguished Service Award. Montgomery County Council President Craig Rice received this award for his outstanding leadership in the effort to end homelessness. Councilmember Rice helped jump start and provide critical support for the implementation of the Montgomery County 100,000 Homes Campaign.

Distinguished Volunteer Award. Valerie Barton received this award for significant contributions toward helping MCCH develop our Speakers Bureau. Through her firm, The Barton Consultancy, Valerie also provided MCCH her expertise in healthcare policy by providing pro bono advice to MCCH on healthcare and Medicaid issues.

Distinguished Partner Award. Enterprise Holdings received this award for their commitment to MCCH and their pivotal leadership in the community. Enterprise has held annual back-to-school and holiday drives for clients in our programs, completed extensive yard beautification projects at our housing sites, and sponsored our gala.

LIVING A HEALTHIER LIFE: CLIENT SUCCESS STORY

At the age of 39, John found himself homeless while struggling to overcome substance abuse. Just four years before that, he had been married with two sons. *"My life was really going downhill,"* he recalls.

While living on the street, he discovered he had high blood pressure and diabetes. Desperate to get his life back on track, he began working at Metro Access, but, still plagued by substance abuse, he found himself out of work in 2007. By 2008, he began sleeping at the White Flint Metro station bus stop a location where he once picked up passengers on his Metro Access route.

Later that year, John became a client at our HBCAC men's emergency shelter where he became sober. In February 2009, with the help of his case manager at HBCAC, John was accepted into our Creative Housing Initiative Pilot Project (CHIPP) housing program. CHIPP provides permanent housing for 16 low-income individual adults who were frequent users of the emergency medical and corrections systems and who often suffer from multiple disabilities.

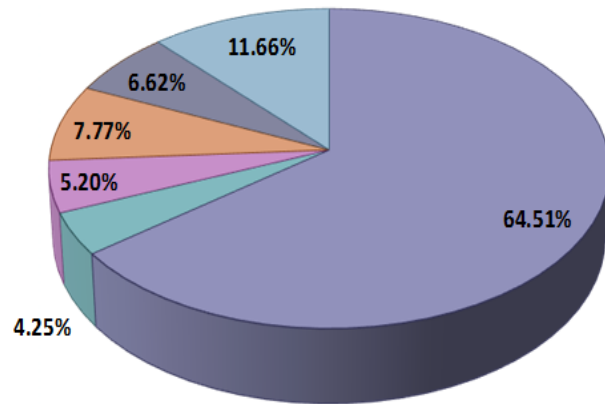
John says that since moving into MCCH's permanent supportive housing he has piece of mind, has been able to repair his relationship with his sons, and feels healthier. *"My case manager got me on the right path to turn my life around,"* said John. *"If it wasn't for this program, I would've been dead."* On September 20, 2014, John celebrated six years of sobriety.



John gives an emotional testimony on how becoming housed changed his life at a Montgomery County 100,000 Homes Campaign press conference.

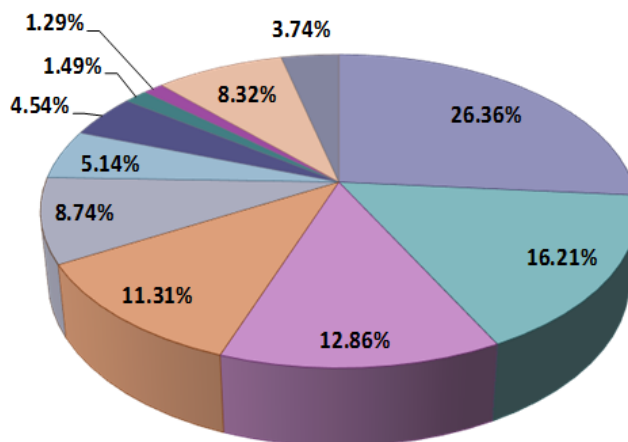
